The National Week of Making, June 16 - June 22, 2017, will continue for its third year. Spearheading the week, <u>Nation of Makers</u> invites you to join in the celebration!

The maker movement starts with the community; the ecosystem of makers and all that they do and create. *The National Week of Making recognizes the contributions and impact of a diversity of makers, hackers, crafters, artists, DIYers, engineers, and manufacturers across the United States, young and old, rural and urban, on the fabric of our country.*

The increasing availability of low-cost tools and technologies for design and prototyping such as 3D printers, laser cutters and microcontrollers, is making it possible for more students and adults to design, develop and prototype their ideas into real projects, products and solutions. In makerspaces, hackerspaces and Fab Labs across the country, individuals are coming together to share their skills in everything from welding and coding to sewing and robotics and work together on projects that are making their communities better places to work, live and play.

More and more, Nation of Makers is seeing makers take on challenges both locally and globally, using their knowledge and skills to improve their lives and the lives of others in their communities. Maker Town Halls are an opportunity to convene both makers and community leaders to discuss the role of the Maker Movement within their local area and to work together towards developing sustainable community outcomes. - On June 21st, at American University in Washington, DC, join a discussion about the impact of making on education at the U.S. Department of Education's <u>showcase and panel discussion</u>.
